Sue Dymock was virtual writer-in-residence for the State Library of Victoria, Melbourne UNESCO City of Literature (2021). Poetry Place, a digital workshop series she led and initiated, tours Nottinghamshire libraries until 2023. Sue is Associate Professor of Education at Nottingham Trent University and researches Young Poets' Stories. What they left behind (Shoestring Press) is her third poetry collection.



Harminder Nagi is a poet from Indian origin, Design Engineer by profession now living in England. He has developed a vivid and light-hearted style, often drawing inspiration from everyday life.

His poems range from jovial and humorous to childhood melancholy and nature. He writes mainly in English but also occasionally pens in Hindi and Punjabi languages.

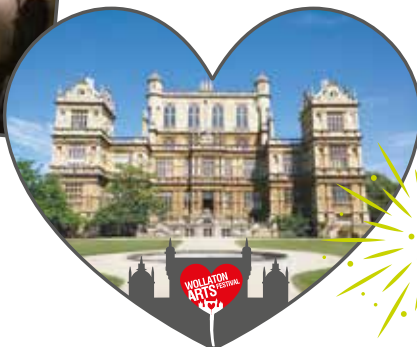
